It is a creative brainstorming technique that helps to generate ideas for new products and to improve on existing ones.


In the workshop, students learnt how to make use of these seven methods to solve the problems that they have in their daily lives.




GRADE SIX

They learnt that not only are there two clauses in a conditional sentence – the conditional clause (the if-condition) and the main clause (the result) – but there are also four types.


Type-0 conditionals deal with factual statements, situations that are always true. An example is *If the date is 25th December, it is Christmas Day*.

Type-1 conditionals deal with possible scenarios; for example, *If I forget my assignment*, *I get a circle in the Homework SMART booklet*.


Type-2 conditionals describe improbable or impossible situations: *If I had a hundred million dollars, I would build a school for gamers.*

Type-3 conditionals show how history would have been different if the past had been changed: *If I had studied harder, I would have gotten 100 marks.*


