The Five Mental Actions

Do you know that when we read and listen actively, we are actually using 5 Mental Actions to increase our understanding of what we are listening to or reading? These are what they are:

1. Monitor Comprehension – we actively make note of what we do or don't understand and find clues in the text to gain meaning of words or phrases

2. Make Predictions – we predict what we are going to read or hear next and then either revise our prediction if we are wrong or find evidence to support our prediction if we are right

3. Make Connections – as we read or listen, we make connections to our experiences and lives to deepen our understanding

4. Mentally Summarise – at various points, we stop and think about what we have just read and put those points into notes, either mentally or physically

 Reformat – we make mental or physical lists categorising what we've read or heard Happy Chinese New Year everybody!

As I read through this PEN issue, I am once again struck by the many varied activities and modules we offer our primary students.

The Grade 1's have been busy with animals and their habitats; the Grade 2's know a lot more about Hong Kong and its past than they did before; the Grade 3's had a great time at the theatre watching Mr. Benn; the Grade 4's are extending their environmental knowledge by learning about the characteristics and effects of different forces of nature; the Grade 5's are learning about different inventors and writing biographies; and lastly, the Grade 6's are dabbling in rotten bananas and living organisms in their science module. 
The children also learned about why and how Hong Kong became a British colony. They found the drug opium interesting and were in

Handover Ceremony in 1997.






The people will see a lot of stars. They can buy different star products, like star stories, star cups, star dolls.

In 1868, Edison began to work for the Western Union Company as telegraph operator. He was very hord-working and at last, also in 1868, invented an "eletric vote-recording machine". This invention made voting process faster.



At the age of 29, Edisor improved Alexande Graham Bette's new telephone. It made the tele ender In 1877, Edison invented the phonograph. it

the first machine that could record and play sound. This invention, made him famous. In 1879, Edison invented a light bulb that lasts very long.


Thomas Edison died in 18 October, 1931. He was a great inventor. He helped change the world and our daily lives.

Yes! Our Grade 6 students carried out the experiment in the classroom. As the banana decomposes over time, it inflates a balloon. Students learned that when you take a rotten banana and put it in the bottle the gases produced can blow up a balloon. Students recorded the changes every day in their experiment log and they were amazed by how a banana can

give off gas with enough bacteria present to inflate the balloon. It might seem disgusting but our Grade 6 students actually had fun doing the experiment.

As an end – of – module project, our Grade 6 students will do a science experiment in a group and video-tape it. We can't wait to see their projects!



English Performing Arts

In Grade 1 and Grade 2, the EPA classes are integrated with the English curriculum.

In Grade 3, the EPA classes focus more on students' performing skills. The Grade 3 students learn four different performing skills in a year. They are **Drama**, **Movement**, **Music and Voice**. They learn two components in each term. By the end of each component, the students will do a final performance either in class or during English week. We went for a hot spring bath but the water was too hot. It was about 57 degrees Celsius. So I


did not like it.
