Now we welcome A new school year!




Students designed and drew their costumes and gadgets and shared with their classmates how their equipment helps them survive in this dangerous world of spying!

# EPA

Our students always have fun in their English Performing Arts (EPA) lessons. It is a wonderful opportunity to express themselves in English.

Grade One and Grade Two EPA is an integrated curriculum.

Grade One students will learn to sing and dance to songs. We learn "The More We Get Together", "Let's Clean Up" and they also learn poems about occupations and about people around them. Towards the end of Module 1, both Grade One and Two students will learn and sing Christmas songs. It's going to be lots of FUN!

Besides singing and drama, we have lessons that compare current music to music from the past, and lessons that connect movement and music. There are also lessons focusing on both voice and drama skills.

There are plenty of activities to keep our students engaged while building their language and critical thinking skills.







In Grades Three and Four, the students build upon the skills they have already learned in EPA. They have the opportunity to study four different modules: Voice, Music, Movement and Drama. Students learn full dances, study play scripts and sing delightful songs; which they share with one another and the school during English Week in Terms 1 and 2. Their experience helps them prepare for the Annual Grade Five Show.







In **Grade Five**, everyone is ready to put all their EPA skills to good use. Students spend the entire year devising, rehearsing and finally performing the Grade Five Show.

In 2021, our school wasn't able to perform the show as planned due to COVID-19 and restrictions. So, over Zoom, the students and EPA teachers created a video drama. We streamed the video for one week in July.

# Featured Teacher

Hello, this is Teacher Ángel. It is pronounced like this: Ahn-hel. So, when you see me around campus, please try your best to say my name as well as you can! My name is so difficult because it is not an English name, it is Spanish. Yes, I teach English but I am from Spain!



I can also help you learn some Spanish if you are interested. More than 560 million people speak Spanish, 460 million of those are native speakers (this is the second largest number of native speakers, only after Mandarin!). Let's start learning something simple: ¡Hola! (Oh-la), this is the way you say "hello" in Spanish.



Sorry, this is not me. I didn't have the chance to go check myself!

Now let me tell you a bit about myself: I was born and raised in southern Spain, in a place called El Ejido. It is a very warm and dry place, which lets us harvest fruit and vegetables during the winter months, when it is very cold in the rest of Europe. The crops grow under a structure covered in plastic, called a "greenhouse", in order to keep the perfect humidity and temperature for the plants. There are so many greenhouses there that we call it "the sea of plastic", you can even see it from space!

I have 3 brothers and a sister, that makes it five of us for my mum and dad! It must have been really tiring for them, but they did a really good job. I am the only one of them who has lived abroad, and I have lived and worked in many different places: Germany, USA, the UK and Mainland China. For the last 10 years, I have called Hong Kong "home". Despite these many years in Hong Kong, I still cannot speak Cantonese, so remember to use English when you speak with me!




